

# Infographic Project

For this assignment, you will individually create a 1-2 page infographic describing the history of colonialism *or* gender inequality in one of the countries you have previously worked on.

**You have a choice whether to analyse its colonial history or gender inequality.**

## *Gender inequality*

If you choose to take the gender inequality angle, you may choose to focus on women's issues and rights or LGBTQ+ issues and rights.

In your infographic, you need to include:

- A **timeline** with at least two critical dates (for example, the year women got the right to vote)
- 2 **statistics** about related issues in education, harassment/violence, and health (example: statistics on death in hospitals, etc). Your statistics do not need to be related to each other.
- 2 **aspects** of life (education, healthcare, politics, etc.) that inequality can be seen in. For example, in Canada, gender inequality can be seen in health care. Indigenous women are twice as likely to die giving birth than white women.
- The bulk of your assignment will be an overview of any relevant **movement** (protest, action to change, e.g., the Black Lives Matter Movement).
  - Include a picture of at least one important figure for the movement with their name
  - Why the movement was created
  - The main goal(s) of the movement
- **References** to where you got all your information in **MLA 9 format**
- Relevant pictures
  - Under each picture provide a short caption explaining how your picture is relevant.

## *Colonialism*

If you choose to take the colonialism angle, you will need to decide if your country was a coloniser or was colonised.

If your country is a coloniser, you need to:

- Provide a **timeline** marking the beginning and end of your country's colonisation of other countries, along with three additional significant dates from the colonisation period of your choice.
- Explain **who your country colonised and why they colonised**.
  - If they colonised multiple countries, choose one to focus on throughout the infographic.
  - Did they colonise for economic reasons? Strategic? Religious?
- Explain the **impacts** of your country's colonisation on the colonised country you decided to focus on.
  - **Politically**
    - Are there changes to how the government is run?
    - Structural racism?
  - **Socially**
    - Is there a disruption to everyday life?
    - Is there any kind of racism or discrimination present?
  - **Economically**
    - Labour?
    - Resource extraction?
    - Are there changes in the economy generally?
- Provide **reasons for decolonization**, specifically in conjunction with the colonised country you already decided to focus on.
  - State one key figure in the country's process of decolonization and their impact/importance. (great idea for a relevant picture)
  - Are there any protests or revolts that reveal the growing unrest of the colonised peoples?
  - Changes in global attitude towards colonisation?
- Provide **references** to where you got all your information in **MLA 9 format**.
- Provide **relevant** pictures to pair with your awesome information.

- Under each picture provide a short caption explaining how your picture is relevant.

If your country was colonised, you need to:

- Provide a **timeline** marking the beginning and end of your country's colonisation, along with three additional significant dates from the period that they were under the colonial rule of your choice.
- Explain **who colonised your country and why**.
  - Was it for economic reasons? Strategic? Religious?
- Explain the **impacts of colonisation**.
  - **Politically**
    - Are there changes to how the government is run?
  - **Socially**
    - Is there a disruption to everyday life?
    - Is there any kind of racism or discrimination present?
  - **Economically**
    - Labour?
    - Resource extraction?
    - Are there changes in the economy generally?
- Describe your country's **fight for independence**
  - State one key figure for your country's fight for independence and their impact/importance. (great idea for a relevant picture)
  - Are there any protests or revolts that reveal the growing unrest of the colonised peoples?
  - Changes in global attitude towards colonisation?
- Provide **references** to where you got all your information in **MLA 9 format**.
- Provide **relevant** pictures to pair with your amazing information.
  - Under each picture provide a short caption explaining how your picture is relevant.
